Dear KDCEA Supporters,

Term 3 was an exciting and tumultuous term filled with joys amidst challenges. I trust that this newsletter may help you grasp God's work in reaching our next generation of young people in Killara High School (KHS) and Lindfield Learning Village (LLV). I pray also that this newsletter may energise you for what is planned for term 4.

- 1. What's happening at KHS and LLV?
- The Year 10s at KHS have been exploring the question: "what does a complete or full life look like?" The stage 5 curriculum on this topic worked really well for year 9s in the previous term, but there wasn't the same level of engagement or interest with the year 10s on this topic. That being said, there was one lesson that went really well, as we contrasted the claim of a full and complete life that this world offers, with the true full and complete life that Jesus provides.
- The year 7s and 8s explored how God worked to build his church in the Book of Acts. In addition to these lessons, the students and I have had an opportunity to delve into some deeper questions about the Christian faith. This has been encouraging to see, as students are thinking more deeply about the things of God. Furthermore, there are a few new students in the year 8 class, which has changed the dynamics of the class in the positive direction.
- The secondary students at LLV have struggled in terms of attendance, but the students who do attend, are very engaged. It is a delight to open God's Word with them to see that the Christian hope we have is not in vain. One of the key features that stood out this term was the Biblical picture of the new heaven and the new earth, and how we can have full assurance of eternal life because of what Jesus has already achieved on the cross.
- The K-2 class at LLV have loved singing this term. One of the joys of this term was seeing them get excited to sing God's truth. The students learnt about Jesus' desire to seek and save the lost through Luke's gospel. A key highlight in Luke's gospel was the story of Jesus and Zacchaeus; the students really seemed to understand the profundity of Jesus saving someone who was undeserving.

2. Term 4 Updates

In term 4, I (Koh) am teaching history in a rural school as part of my last teaching placement at university. As such, I won't be teaching SRE at KHS or LLV this term. However, with the help of Henri, Michael, Paul, and Jon, all of the classes are covered in my absence. I thank God for all of these men who have a conviction to reach the lost in our schools. I particularly thank God for Paul and Michael for taking my class load while I am away, for without their additional help, many gospel opportunities would have been lost.

- Pray for the next generation of Christian students that they might grow in courage and grace to speak the truth in love to their friends at school.
- Pray that God might work by his Spirit to change the hearts of those who have no interest in the Bible.
